AS THE SPORTS GOVERNING BODY FOR STUDENT-ATHLETES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN, HUSKIE ATHLETICS PROVIDES THE OPPORTUNITY TO STUDENTS TO PLAY SPORT AT AN ELITE LEVEL WHILE OBTAINING A UNIVERSITY DEGREE. THE 15 DIFFERENT ATHLETIC TEAMS COMPETE IN THE CANADA WEST UNIVERSITIES ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION, ONE OF FOUR REGIONS IN THE 51 MEMBER CANADIAN INTERUNIVERSITY SPORT (CIS). WITH 92 CANADA WEST CHAMPIONSHIPS AND 24 CIS CHAMPIONSHIPS, UNDER ITS BELT HUSKIE ATHLETICS IS ONE OF THE MOST DOMINANT PROGRAMS IN THE COUNTRY. HUSKIE ATHLETES LEAVE THE CAMPUS AND THE UNIVERSITY OF SASKATCHEWAN WITH THE SKILLS TO BECOME SUCCESSFUL AT WORK, WITH FAMILY AND IN THE COMMUNITY. The University of Saskatchewan Huskie women's track & field team enters the CIS Championship as the Canada West champion for the 20th time in team history.

The Huskies with a deep and powerful team led through both days of Canada West competition, eventually finishing with 119.50 points, more than 20 points ahead of the closest team. It is the second consecutive year that the Huskies are conference champions. The Huskies won five titles in a row from 1996-97 season to the 2000-01 season. Saskatchewan's women's team enters the CIS Championship boasting top veterans and rookies looking to claim medals. They enter the championship ranked No. 2 in the CIS.

Andrew Smith, Taylor Petrucha, Keegan Sharp and Chris Crossley will lead the men's team into the CIS Championship. Crossley enters after having one of the most successful conference championships in Canada West history. Competing in the pentathlon, long jump and 60-metre hurdles, Crossley medaled in all including a gold in both the pentathlon and long jump. He scored 4009 points in the pentathlon shattering a Canada West and Saskatchewan record. It was also the second highest points ever scored in the pentathlon in Canada. He is ranked No. 1 in the pentathlon and fifth in the long jump. He was named the Most Outstanding Male Field Performer. Sharp is ranked No. 3 in the pentathlon.

Fifth-year middle distance runner Kailey Smith, fifth-year pole-vaulter Leah Vause and fourth-year distance runner Jodi Souter were once again standouts at the conference championship. Smith, who is ranked No. 4 in the CIS in the 1000m, walked away with Canada West gold medals in both the 600m and 1000m races at the Canada West Championship. Vause cleared 3.93m to claim the gold medal on the weekend. Both Vause and Smith will look to upgrade their CIS silver medal from 2009. She is currently ranked No. 2 in the country. Souter won double bronze in the 1500m and the 3000m on the weekend. Earlier in the year, she was crowned the Canada West women's cross country champion.

Sophomore standout Taryn Suttie enters the CIS Championship ranked No. 1 in the shot put and No. 2 in the weight throw. She won double gold in the events at the Canada West Championship and was crowned the Most Outstanding Female Field Performer. She is undefeated this year. Third year sprinter Sharai Siemens has been a consistent force in the 300m, winning another silver at the conference championship. The Huskie women's team is also strong in the relays winning gold at the conference event in the 4X800, a bronze in the 4X200 and a silver in the 4X400. Smith, Souter and Siemens all partake on

Smith enters ranked first in the shot put and third in the weight throw. He won a gold medal in the shot put at the Canada West Championship and a silver in the weight throw. Smith set a Huskie record with a throw of 17.22m this season. He will look to upgrade his CIS silver medal. Pole-vaulter Petrucha, who returned to competition after a year absence, also broke a Canada West record clearing 5.21m. Petrucha is ranked No. 2 in the CIS after clearing 5.31-metres in January. His best finish at the CIS level was a bronze medal. Rookie vaulter Lane Britnell, a nominee for Male Rookie of the Year, will also compete for the Huskies.

The men claimed four gold medals, four silver and three bronze for their second place finish at the Canada West Championship. The 4X200m relay won bronze for the men's team. The Huskies enter CIS ranked No. 4.

Tough losses for the team include 2008-09 CIS gold medalist in weight throw Elisabeth Dubourt, who has decided not to use eligibility this season, and 1000m CIS silver medalist Iain McCormick.

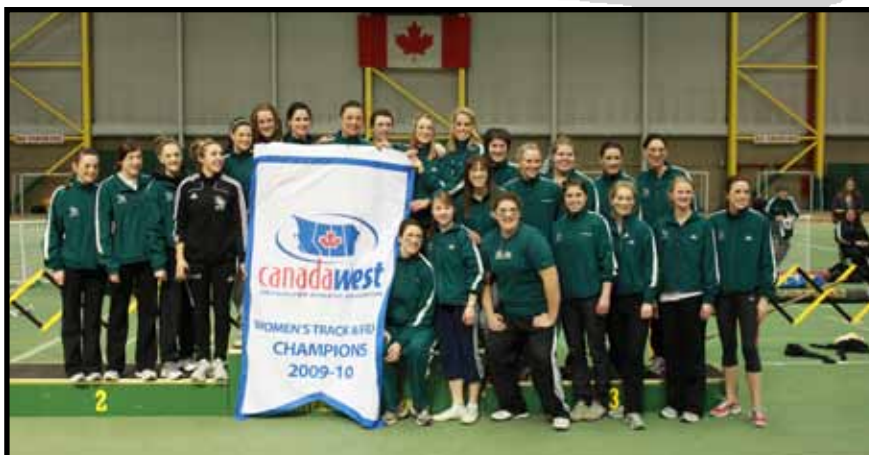

McTaggart is a member of the Huskie Athletics Wall of Fame, Saskatoon Sports Hall of Fame and Saskatchewan Sports Hall of Fame and Museum.

Prior to taking over the head coach role, McTaggart had been an assistant coach with the team working with the sprinters since 2006.

About the University of Saskatchewan

Location

The main campus is 2,425 acres and Innovation Place Research Park is another 500 acres. The University also owns land elsewhere in Saskatoon as well as around Saskatchewan.

Where Great Minds Meet

The Act establishing the University of Saskatchewan was passed by the Legislative Assembly on April 3, 1907. The U of S celebrates its 100th birthday in 2007. The first classes in Arts & Science began in 1909 with a registration of 70 students. These classes were held in the Drinkle Building, in downtown Saskatoon. On October 12, 1912 the first building on campus, the College Building, was opened for student admissions. It was declared a provincial (1982) and federal (2000) heritage building.

Colleges and Schools

The University of Saskatchewan offers 58 degrees, diplomas and certificates in over 100 areas and disciplines. Colleges and schools include: Agriculture & Bioresources, Arts and Science, Commerce, Dentistry, Education, Engineering, Graduate Studies and Research, Kinesiology, Law, Medicine (includes Physical Therapy), Nursing, Pharmacy and Nutrition, Veterinary Medicine, and the Extension Division.

Faculty & Staff

The U of S prides itself on its outstanding and diverse faculty and staff that number about 7,000. The University, with associated organizations like



Innovation Place and the Royal University Hospital, is the City of Saskatoon's second largest employer, making up about eight percent of the city's work force.

Historical Highlights

The U of S student newspaper The Sheaf has been in continuous

publication since 1912. In the 1940s and 1950s, the U of S pioneered the use of radiation for cancer treatment. Canada's first department of Drama was established at the U of S in 1945. Since 1971, the University's Crop Development Centre has bred and released more than 200 new field crop varieties. Canada's first Native Law Centre was established at the University of Saskatchewan.

Students

The U of S strives to prepare students for the knowledge age. In 2008-09, approximately 19,700 undergraduate and graduate students were enrolled.

Budget

In 2007-08 the University had an operating budget of \$311 million.
